


THE WORDS OF ST. FRANCIS OF ASSISI BRING TO LIFE OUR MISSION AND

In 2013 there were 782 drug overdoses from heroin in New York State--420 were fatal. The death toll from heroin has more than doubled over the last three years. Alcoholism and drug dependency affect nearly every family, and there are no boundaries when it comes to

phone calls per day, connecting with men and their families who are desperately seeking help for their addiction. Each man is greeted by an Admission Clerk and fellow Brother Christopher and is encouraged on this first step towards a life of recovery.

Assessments

"The staff and everyone here do an awesome job, and show real compassion in what they are doing here."

To help the staff understand each client and their individual needs for treatment, after admission, each man in need is scheduled for a comprehensive assessment, including a one-to-one meeting with a member of the Counseling Management Team.

Scholarships

"I cannot write enough about how much SCI has changed my life."

Scholarships for treatment are reserved for men who show a serious commitment to doing the difficult work required for a life in recovery—especially since resources for treatment continue to decline, while the need for treatment grows. There is no question—this resource saves lives.

Treatment

"Being in a group therapy environment belped me to open up and trust in my peers and my counselors, I think I have made great progress in sharing and giving feeдback."



Treatment at St. Christopher's Inn is holistic and varied based on the needs of the client. We strive to restore the personal dignity of each individual, which is accomplished through specialized group therapy including: encouragement group, young persons group and coping skills, among others.

"Having to go to work everyday here is a great way to get my mind back into the reality of providing for my family and myself again. By having me work here I feel that I am giving back to the friars, staff, and the community that saved my life."

Medical Services

"SCI was by far the best inpatient facility I have been in. The staff gave me the shovel to help me dig out my personal issues that I have had buried in me for years, where other inpatient facilities I have been in I avoided doing that."

The medical team at St. Christopher's Inn takes an active role in the education and treatment of all clients. From psychiatric testing and psychotherapy to episodic sick calls, most services and supplies provided through the Article 28 New York State licensed clinic are funded only by charitable donations from our generous benefactors.

"I found a new purpose through my recovery. I learned how to keep myself centered in the present and not feel the guilt from the past and challenged by anxieties regarding the future. Most important I began the process of learning to love myself again by helping others around me and sharing the things I have learned."

Food and Meals

"Ms. Janet is an amazing woman and her wait staff bas treated me with much respect and love as a fellow brother. Janet has a special way about her and I will always remember her talks, walks, and strength."

Many of the men who find their way to the Inn have been without proper nourishment for their

bodies and their minds for so long that eating and sharing meals in our family style dining room become a pivotal part of their journey to recovery.

Family Program

"Family program was an excellent experience."

The three-session family program at St. Christopher's Inn allows family members and current clients to see and confront issues like denial and secrecy, as well as explore and

discuss how the disease of addiction has impacted their family lives. This resource allows clients and families to move forward in recovery, rebuilding their lives and relationships.

"I learned that I suffer from a disease that affects my family also. I have to say that there was not a lecture that I did not learn from. Michael Boccia's lectures were a thing of pure intelligence and beauty."

Smoking Cessation

When you consider the estimated statistic that anywhere between 50-75% of smokers in recovery die tobacco-related deaths, then you have to consider smoking cessation as an important option in addiction treatment. Since the program started in 2004, hundreds of clients have successfully quit smoking during their time at St. Christopher's Inn.

Did you know? Nearly 50% of the men who joined the Smoking Cessation Program successfully quit smoking.

"I completed the smoking cessation program and I have been smoking for 14 years. Wonderful program."

Treatment Completion

Brothers Christopher House

- In 2014, BCH had a 90% completion rate.
- All who completed obtained meaningful employment and secured permanent housing.
- Most graduates remain in the White Plains area and stay connected to BCH as a way of giving back.

St. Christopher's Inn opened Brothers Christopher House, a transitional house where men can continue their treatment beyond the grounds of the Inn, while transitioning back into their communities.

Did you know?

- There are three phases of treatment at Brothers Christopher House.
 - → Phase 1 lasts for 30 days. Residents are assigned to a fellow resident, and are always accompanied when they leave the house.
 - → Phase 2 generally lasts for 60 days. Residents are permitted out of the house during the day and may apply for a weekend pass once per month.
 - → Phase 3 lasts for a minimum of 60 days. Residents in Phase 3 enroll in a school or training program, and/or begin looking for work. Phase 3 residents are also required to volunteer in the community as a way of giving back.
