The Importance of Vocational Therapeutic **Opportunities in Recovery**

Vocational therapeutic service is critical in the healing process of recovery. These vocational service opportunities enhance connections with others, build selfesteem, self-sufficiency, personal responsibility, and aid stress management. Along with these benefits comes self-worth and community building. St. Christopher's Inn is a recovery community that recognizes that we are all part of each other's stories.

From the first day a Brother Christopher enters St. Christopher's Inn, a personalized treatment plan is established, incorporating vocational activities that will be part of their treatment experience during their stay at St. Christopher's Inn. Brothers Christopher vocational activity can be placed anywhere on the Holy Mountain such as in the kitchens of the Inn. the Friary and the Convent; in facilities maintenance and groundskeeping, on the San Damiano Farm, in the That Nothing Be Lost Thrift Shop and even in the Admissions Department greeting new Brothers Christopher. Vocational therapeutic services such as these restore a sense of purpose and most importantly, restore the basic human need of belonging and being a positive contributor to one's community.





Brothers Christopher have the option of receiving a completion certificate when they are ready to leave the Inn, listing their completed vocational services and skills they may have obtained. The therapeutic vocational program is a critical piece of our continuum of care helping our Brothers Christopher build a solid foundation of recovery along with meaning and purpose.

Maintaining a robust healing program that is open to all men seeking recovery requires a lot of assistance. As an independent non-profit ministry of the Franciscan Friars of the Atonement, we rely on support from many sources. Recently, St. Christopher's Inn received support from several family and community foundations including the Koch Foundation, the Peter and Henry Block Foundation, the Theresa and Edward O'Toole Foundation, The Hyde and Watson Foundation and the Sexauer Foundation. The support of these foundations has helped us tremendously. Through their generosity, we have purchased a new vehicle to transport Brothers Christopher to various appointments and experiences that further their recovery. We are refurbishing an on-site bakery where men can learn culinary skills. We installed an irrigation system at San Damiano Farm where water now flows freely from the top of the hill by the Friary, down to the farm. Before, water was supplied by laboriously trucking the water down the hill in large vats. This new water system eliminated this exhausting method of transporting

Anyone who has spent one full day in treatment at the Inn or has successfully completed our Outpatient Program can become a member of the St. Christopher's Inn Alumni Association (SCIAA). SCIAA serves the mission of the Inn in many ways including: recovery-focused meetings, hosting both fellowship and fundraising events, offering retreats and even financial support. The Annual SCIAA Picnic brings close to 400 people back to the Holy Mountain for a day of fellowship, support, and a special remembrance of those Brothers we have lost to substance use, both alcohol and drugs. Residents at the Inn join in the Alumni Picnic that includes a softball game, great food and recovery meetings.

Other annual SCIAA events include: Tee Off Against Addiction Golf Outing, a Thanksgiving Dinner, and a pizza party at the Inn. This year, we were especially blessed to gather as a community to hear the songs and stories of Matt Butler, the Reckless Son, who shared a bit of his own journey and even performed a song he wrote about St. Christopher's Inn.





SCIAA members embody what it feels like to enjoy a sober life in recovery. Current Brothers Christopher know that they are not alone along their journey and that recovery is real and possible.
